<b>Course Offerings</b>
Classes are \$25 per term. Registration fees are due by the first class. Students will be expected to bring a pen/pencil and a notebook to class. Class sizes will vary, but will be no less than 4 and no more than 10. This is to ensure students get the best experience possible. All classes are for ages 16 and up, with the exception of the Youth Introduction to Improv. Classes meet on Saturdays unless otherwise noted.
<p>_____ <b>Intro to Improv Level 1 (Feb 4-Mar 24; 12:30pm-2pm) (additional offering: Apr 7-May 26)</b></p> <p>This is an 8 week class. This is a very basic introduction to improv. No experience necessary. Students will learn how to think in the moment while working together as an ensemble. Students will also get a brief history of improv and will learn the different styles and techniques used. The focus of this class will be learning how to create believable characters and situations while learning to work with the ensemble to create a scene.</p> <p>_____ <b>Comedy Writing and Improv Level 2 (Apr 7-May 26; 2pm-3:30pm)</b></p> <p>Prerequisite: Completion of Intro to Improv Level 1</p> <p>This is an 8 week class. This is an intermediate level of improv. Students in this class will learn the importance of scene structure. Students will learn basic five-point scene structure as well as an improv style known as the "Harold" (long form improv). There will be a heavy influence on comedy writing in this course. Students will be expected to complete weekly writing exercises and work with the class to polish their writing skills.</p> <p>_____ <b>Long Form Advanced Improv Level 3</b></p> <p>Prerequisite: Completion of Comedy Writing and Improv Level 2</p> <p>This is an 8 week class. This is the advanced level of improv. At this level students should be able to fully construct a long form scene while creating believable characters and situations. The focus of this class will be mastering the improv and writing techniques from the previous classes. Students will be expected to work together to create a full length show which will be performed after the term is completed.</p> <p>_____ <b>Youth Introduction to Improv (Feb 4-Mar 24; 11:00am-12:30pm)</b></p> <p>This is an 8 week class designed for children ages 8-15 as an introduction to Improv comedy and techniques.</p>
